

## Programs

### Teacher Recognition Awards – \$2,000

### Enrichment Grants – \$20,500

- Golden HS: \$4000 for Senior Seminar trip to Washington, DC (partial); 1,000 school newspaper copies; and High Altitude Balloon project.
- Bell MS: \$4000 for Leap into Middle School program (partial).
- Kyffin ES: \$2500 for Garden to Table and Growe Foundation resource
- Mitchell ES: \$2500 for materials and texts to increase mathematical discussion and rigor
- Ralston ES: \$2500 for Mimio Board
- Shelton ES: \$2500 for Reading A to Z and more robotics equipment
- Welchester ES: \$2500 for Overtime Athletics after-school sports

### Scholarship Program – \$6,000

We awarded \$1,500 Scholarships for college or vocational school to four eligible GHS graduating seniors who have been enrolled at least six years at any Golden neighborhood school.

### Teaching Excellence – \$7,000

Each school can receive \$1000 to support teacher release time to participate in professional development, job training, and/or peer collaboration sessions.

### Mental Health and Wellness – \$1,500

In spring 2019, we launched a Mental Health and Wellness Program focused on Restorative Practice training for teachers and staff at Golden neighborhood schools.

### Tish Agos Credit Recovery Scholarships – \$1,500

Conceived by former GHS Assistant Principal Tish Agos, this program improves the graduation rates at GHS by funding recovery credit courses for struggling students.

### Summer Academic Boot Camp – \$500

The the AP/Honors Summer Boot Camp at Golden HS is a free program to help prepare incoming AP students for AP classes.
